

Information and updates for residents affected by the Pigeon Valley Fire, from Nelson Tasman Civil Defence and our fire response partners

Saturday 23 February 2019

As you know, the fire-fighting effort is still ongoing, and we appreciate your patience with this.

Controlled access for residents

Controlled access is still in place for residents of Redwood, Eves and Teapot valleys, with the condition that you remain ready to evacuate again immediately if the situation changes and the fire risk increases again.

We're still keeping a close watch on the fire fighting progress and weather forecast and will let you know if you need to evacuate again via text, Facebook and the Nelson Tasman Civil Defence website.

Fire zone still active

Please be aware that many of your properties are still in an active fire fighting zone. This means there may be some areas of your property you can't access as they're part of the fire-fighting operation, and parts of your property that firefighters may need to access to keep the fire under control. The 'no-go zone' on the fire map outlines the areas you are to avoid, and is updated as the situation changes.

Access for contractors to the valleys

If you need to have a contractor, insurance assessor or other advisor visit your property in the restricted area, please make sure they apply for a permit first by calling Tasman District Council on 03 543 8400.

We'll assess applications on a case-by-case basis for essential service providers.

Red Cross and Rural Support visits

This weekend Pigeon Valley residents may receive a visit from Red Cross and Rural Support Trust to check on your wellbeing and to see whether you need any help or support. Remember that the Government Helpline is also available if you need support (0800 779 997).

Rapid impact assessments

If you live in an area which has been affected by the fire, you may have noticed that Urban Search and Rescue teams have been conducting high-level assessments of the impact of the fire over the past couple of days. We are still

analysing the information from these assessments and the results will be used to inform the recovery plan and prioritisation for the area.

Civil Defence Centre

The Civil Defence Centre at New Life Church, 85 Wensley Road in Richmond will be open from 10am to 4pm this Saturday and Sunday.

If you were affected by the Pigeon Valley fire and would like to know where you can get support, please visit us this weekend and we'll put you in touch with the services you need.

After the weekend, we'll be deciding when to close the centre.

Mayoral Disaster Relief Fund

The Nelson Tasman District Mayoral Disaster Relief Fund has been set up by the Tasman District and Nelson City Councils to help those most severely affected by the Pigeon Valley fire.
